Bone, Joint or Muscle Pain?

Get seen by a First Contact Physiotherapist at Victoria & Mapperley Practice

Additional roles have been introduced across Nottingham City to support our **Primary** Care Networks (PCNs) and GP practices. From a patient point of view it means you may be offered an appointment with a clinician other than a nurse or doctor when booking an appointment. From a practice point of view it means there is more clinical support available for patients.

First Contact Physiotherapy is one of the new roles introduced here at our Practice.

Who are First Contact Physiotherapists (FCPs)?

They are experienced specialists who can be your first point of care without the need to see a GP first. In many cases, they can see you sooner than you would be by a GP.

What can a First Contact Physiotherapists do?

FCPs help patients with both suspected and diagnosed Musculoskeletal (MSK) conditions. They can assist with issues involving muscles, ligaments, tendons, and joints. Common concerns include joint pain, muscle pain, sports injuries, neck or back pain, soft tissue injuries, sciatica, or trapped nerves.

- Your FCP will assess, diagnose, and provide advice along with a treatment plan.
- They may also refer you for further tests or to other specialist services if needed.

It's important to note that while FCPs offer expert assessments and management plans, they do not provide ongoing physiotherapy sessions. If ongoing treatment is required, you will be referred to an outpatient physiotherapy service.

How do I book an appointment with my FCP?

Booking an appointment is simple – just contact reception and request to see a FCP. Our reception team is trained to assist you. If you're comfortable sharing that your issue involves muscles, bones, nerves, or joints when booking, we'll ensure you are scheduled with the appropriate First Contact Physiotherapist.

<u>Contraceptive Pill</u> <u>without a prescription</u>

Pharmacies now offer the contraceptive pill without a prescription. You don't need to see a doctor or nurse.



Getting the contraceptive pill is free, with or without a prescription.

You may be able to get the contraceptive pill from a pharmacy if you need to:

- Start the contraceptive pill for the first time.
- Take it again after a break from using it.

If you already have a prescription you can use it as usual. Or you can get the pill from a pharmacy without a prescription if you prefer.

Travel Vaccinations

Please note that as of 1st November 2024 our travel vaccination service will change.

This has been done in order to ensure that other essential services can be delivered effectively.

Our only travel vaccination clinic will be as follows:

On the First Friday of the Month From: 2pm to 5.30pm at Victoria Health Centre

You can access a paid travel vaccination service at: <u>Glasshouse Street Pharmacy</u>, <u>Boots</u> and some other travel clinics and pharmacies.

Vaccinations are important to protect yourself and your loved one. Also, for your travel insurance to be valid, you need to have had the recommended vaccinations.



We advise you prepare for your trip <u>at least</u> 6 - 8 weeks before you travel.

Some vaccines need to be given well in advance to allow your body to develop immunity and some involve a number of doses spread over several weeks or months.

Winter Vaccinations Stay Well this Winter...



The <u>covid-19 vaccination</u> will <u>not</u> be offered here at the Victoria & Mapperley Practice this autumn.

It will only be available at community pharmacies.

Eligible people include those who:

- Are aged 65 or over.
- Live in care homes for older adults.
- Are pregnant.
- Have certain health conditions.
- Are a frontline health or social care worker.

You can also book through your **local pharmacy.**

Flu Vaccination

The <u>flu vaccine</u> helps protect against <u>flu</u>, which can be a serious or life-threatening illness. It's offered on the NHS to people at higher risk of getting seriously ill from flu.

You can get the free NHS flu vaccine if you:

- Are aged 65 or over.
- Have certain health conditions.
- Are pregnant.
- Live in a care home.
- Are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance.
- Live with someone who has a weakened immune system.
- Are a frontline health or social care worker.
- Children can also have the nasal spray vaccine - <u>check eligibility here</u>

Book Your Flu Vaccination:

Use the <u>NHS App</u>, call your GP surgery or speak to your <u>Local Pharmacist</u>.

RSV & the RSV Vaccination



Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is a common respiratory virus and is a common cause of coughs and colds. Most people get it several times during their life. People usually recover within 2 weeks, however, it is particularly dangerous for infants under 1 year and older people.

RSV affects the lungs and can cause **pneumonia** and other life threatening conditions in older adults with thousands requiring hospitalisation and intensive care in severe cases every year.

By the time children are 2 or 3 years old, most have been infected with RSV at least once, with few problems. However, for some it can be life threatening and RSV sends more babies to hospital than any other infection.

The new **RSV vaccine** offers huge opportunities to prevent severe illness in those most vulnerable helping to protect lives and so ease winter pressures for the NHS.

Having the RSV vaccination in pregnancy reduces a baby's risk of severe RSV lung infection by around 70% in the first 6 months of life.

If you're at least 28 weeks pregnant Or Aged 75 to 79 you can be vaccinated If you're 28 or more weeks pregnant - speak to their maternity service to arrange an appointment to ensure your baby is protected.

If you're aged 75 to 79 you will be invited by your GP surgery.

Please Note: this vaccine will not be given at the same time as the flu jab. 3
